

QUIDAM DE REVEL

ANALYSIS BY PATRICIA CAGÉ *In May 1993, Quidam de Revel left French shores. More than a great sport horse - he had been the best French competitor at the Olympic Games in Barcelona and one of the pillars of the French team under the saddle of the talented Hervé Godignon. Carrier of a formidable genetic heritage that the French allowed to escape from their clutches, with some consolation nevertheless.*

At 15-years old, he is still one of the best ambassadors of French breeding across Europe. That is without counting the fact that, ahead of some of the best current combinations, he carried off one of the most coveted Grands Prix, that of Hannover, under the saddle of the young Thomas Velin, just a few weeks ago.

Quidam de Revel unites two of the most important lines of Selle Français breeding which have ever existed; on the one side, the invaluable Jalisco B, father of Quidam and, on the other, one who has been ranked number one in France, the remarkable Uriel. Jalisco B was by a sire who later became a breeding world leader, Almé, out of Tanagra, a foundation mare of Mr. Georges Sabras in Normandy. Tanagra, daughter of the best thoroughbred cross ever used in France, Furioso, had an exceptional production which blossomed in the field of sport, and resulted in Danoso (ISO 178) by Night and Day, best French horse in 1976 and 1978 and a member of the French team under the saddle of Daniel Constant. With Night and Day, Tanagra also produced Escurial (ISO 145), second in the national final for 6-year olds with Janou Lefebvre, and mother of the stallions Kissovo and Urous. After the birth of Jalisco, Tanagra was partnered with Nykio, with whom she produced two stallions, Kioto and Nykias, before coming back to Night and Day and giving birth to Oviedo II, exported to the USA. Finally, at the age of 20 years, she produced the stallion Ruy Blas. Of her broodmare daughters, one should mention Quanagra (Galoubet A), notably, the mother of Viking du Tillard

(ISO 184) who was a member of the French team at the Atlanta Olympic Games; Maharanée (Night and Day), grandmother of the stallions Arioso du Theillet and Icône (Night and Day), and mother of the stallions Thoas du Theillet and Valero du Theillet.

In France, Jalisco B came to be thought of as a phenomenon. During the various stages of the 'cycle classique' for young horses impressions were medium. At the age of five, he finished 8th in his age group Championships. One year later, he was 8th in the Grand Final and ranked 4th for prizemoney in his generation. Jalisco pursued his career under the saddle of Xavier Leredde, son of Fernand Leredde of Rouges breeding fame, who needs no introduction. Suffice to say, he was responsible for the star stallion, Papillon Rouge (a son of Jalisco B) and Rochet M, formerly Rochet Rouge (another Jalisco son), who won a bronze medal at the Atlanta Olympic Games with Alexandra Ledermann. Following victory in the magnificent Grand Prix of the CSIO Paris, at the Hippodrome of Longchamp in 1983, and pre-selected for the Los Angeles Games, the French Olympic dream collapsed after he suffered an injury on the Spanish circuit at Barcelona in 1984. Jalisco was, thereafter, sold to Mr. Géraldes, who gave him to Manuel Malta da Costa. Under Portuguese colours, Jalisco B participated at the Olympic Games in Seoul in 1988, then returned to France to pursue his stallion career with the mares of his own studbook. Unlike his son, Quidam de Revel, whose semen is available today in numerous different breeding coun-

tries, Jalisco B's de luxe services were only put at the disposal of those mares who were destined to carry his progeny. His semen could not support the effects of freezing, and long distance transportation. Jalisco B was struck down by an attack of colic at the dawn of the '94 covering season, at the Lieu Plaisant Stud farm, close to Lisieux in Calvados. He was 19 years old.

But we must go back a stage - to 1979. Jalisco B, at the age of four when a certain lady, who was later to become Henriette Evain, was advised by Fernand Leredde not to ignore the qualities of her young stallion. Only the best mares, prizewinners themselves, or of good family lines, should be given to him. Thus, in 1980, Olisco, Ocelot d'Elle and Osco du Banney were born followed, one year later, by Papillon Rouge, Privilège and Palme de Revel. In 1982, along came the two foals, so often associated with the French team, Quidam de Revel and Quito de Baussy who have contributed to CSIO's as well as World and European Championships and have constantly perpetuated Jalisco's reputation. In 1995, he was the number one stallion in the world on the WBFSH rankings, with eight compe-

ting offspring - prizewinners at CSI and CSIO Grands Prix, or Nations Cups.

Among the prestigious mares who came to be covered by Jalisco B was Dirka (ISO 156), a daughter of Nankin, born at the home of Mrs. Marguerite Savary in Calvados. A winner in young horse classes, the little Dirka (1m63), having had good results at CSI level with the Brazilian

vel. One must understand that Dirka only joined Fernand Leredde at the age of 16 after her proprietor, Prince de Broglie chose to instal himself in Switzerland when the Socialist Government came to power in France during the 1980's. Dirka was, in fact, followed to the Haras des Rouges by her daughters, Orka and Tosca. A quick analysis of her stock brings a rapid understanding of the interest she generated in a breeder. Ondine de Baugy, the mother of Dirka, had, with Nankin, five females, who all became brood mares. Thétis B, Bérénice and Géondie de Baugy remained with their breeder, Mrs. Savary. From Ondine's descendants came a number of winners, and the stallions Sheyenne and Sioux de Baugy. The mother of Ondine is none other than Nadine, mother of four products of whom Jesabelle de Baugy is an exceptional brood mare. Jesabelle had five foals, all from Nankin; the first, Troubadour B (ISO 153), winner of the 6-year old final who went to CSI level with Janou Lefebvre and then CCI (ICC 151); Uriel, principle national stallion of the Selle Français studbook, and long-time star of the National Stud at St. Lô, considered a leader of his breed and head of a long list of fathers of CSO winners in France between 1978 and 1988; Commandeur, winner at CSI for Switzerland; Daguet de Baugy (ISO 148) CSI winner for Belgium; and Voulzie, broodmare and mother, notably, of the stallion Furiel de Baugy.

And there we have the bloodlines which have endowed Quidam de Revel.

Quidam still arouses excitement. Acquired at two-
